EXECUTIVE PROFILE

Prof. Ernest Ojukwu, SAN, is an advocate-practitioner, legal scholar and legal education reformer. Appointed Senior Advocate of Nigeria in 2014 by the Legal Practitioners Privileges Committee, he unites four decades of elite litigation practice with a distinguished academic career spanning Abia State University, the Nigerian Law School (where he served as Deputy Director-General and Head of Augustine Nnamani Campus for over a decade), Madonna University and Baze University. He is the founding President of NULAI Nigeria, principal architect of clinical legal education (referred to as the father of clinical legal education in Nigeria) and legal education reforms in Nigeria and across West Africa, and a recognised expert witness before the High Courts of England and Wales. His scholarship, advocacy and institution-building have earned national and international acclaim from the Nigerian Bar Association, traditional authorities, and global justice-education organisations.
